1. Call to Order – @ 7:00pm

2. Approval of Consent Agenda and December Meeting Minutes

On motion made and seconded, the February Meeting Minutes and March Meeting Agenda were unanimously approved.

3. President's Steering Committee Report

Marilyn announced the following upcoming meetings:

4. State Senate Office

On March 16 from 4:30 – 6:30 there will be a reception at the Campbell Office honoring the Senator's 5 Women of the Year.

5. SJPD

Assistant Chief of Police Dave Knopf presented. He passed along apologies from Chief Garcia, who was presenting at a forum Cal State East Bay. The UTEP Pedestrian/Vehicle Stop Demographic Study is available at SJPD.org. First analysis since 2007. Some disparities exist, but SJPD fared pretty well compared to other agencies. Work will continue to reduce actual and/or perceived bias in SJPD regarding stops. 2 training academies going on: 29 Officers in one, 30 in the other.

6. San Jose City Budget

Lee Wilcox led a budget game exercise featuring interactive web polling. 56 users logged into the system and answered questions ranging from your favorite sports team to ranking city services by order of importance. After a break during which Mayor Sam Liccardo spoke to the audience, Mr. Wilcox finished the meeting by explaining the budget process, and taking feedback on two topics: what would help make your neighborhood great and how might we make these into a reality?

7. Mayor Sam Liccardo

Mayor Liccardo spoke extensively about his budget focus for the upcoming fiscal year. The city is working to restore core services (Police, Fire, Libraries, Community Centers and Street Maintenance) to January 2011 levels. He noted that the City is already seeing the benefits of the passage of Measure F; there are four times as many recruits in the upcoming police academy class than the prior class. The Mayor also announced the BeautifySJ initiative to help clean up our city. The City is pushing CalTrans to do a better job of graffiti abatement on our highways, launching an improved app for incident reporting, and soon will provide free unlimited large item pickup. The Mayor's state of the city address will be 2/11 at Gunderson High School beginning at 10:00am.
